## Brief Factsheet: High school completion/graduation rates, Indigenous peoples, Census 2021\*

- The overall high school graduation rate for the Indigenous Peoples is 67% (71% for off-reserve, 49% for on-reserve, 72% non-Status, 61% status) compared to 83% for non-Indigenous population (83% for off-reserve and 80% on-reserve).
  - First Nations (North American Indians) Peoples:
    - Overall high school graduation rate is 63%
    - o On-reserve high school graduation rate is 49%
    - o Off-reserve high school graduation rate is 69%
    - Status high school graduation rate is 60%
    - Non-Status high school graduation rate is 72%
    - o On-reserve Status high school graduation rate is 49%.
    - o On-reserve non-Status population high school graduation rate is 54%
    - o Off-reserve Status high school graduation rate is 67%
    - o Off-reserve non-Status high school graduation rate is 72%

Overall, this descriptive/preliminary data suggests that higher high school gradation rates are associated with non-Status First Nations Peoples living off-reserve.

## • The Métis Peoples:

- o Overall high school graduation rate is 74.6%
- Off-reserve Métis high school graduation rate is 75%
- o On-reserve Métis high school graduation rate 59%
- o Non-status Métis high school graduation rate is 74.9%
- Status Métis high school graduation rate is 71.9%

Overall, this descriptive/preliminary data suggests, again, that higher high school gradation rates are associated with non-Status Métis Peoples living off-reserve.

## • The Inuit Peoples:

- o Overall high school graduation rate is 45.5%.
- Inuit Peoples living inside Nunangat have high school graduation rate of 33%.
- o Inuit Peoples living inside Nunangat have high school graduation rate of 70%

Overall, this descriptive/preliminary data suggests that Inuit Peoples living outside Nunangat have notably higher high school graduation rates than Inuit Peoples living inside Nunangat.
